Alternatives to popcorn, with Malva Askerup and Ivo Blackwood

We invited friends to watch films and prepare food together in various locations. Later we designed a broadsheet newspaper that compiles recipes and the kitchen utensils we have used.







Dal: a warming dish that we ate on the sofa with spoons and bowls, as a group of four people crowded under a blanket, watching 'Spring Breakers' by Harmony Korine.

A week after the end of spring break (and with it being March now) we will watch 'Spring Breakers'. Please come (once again) to Farabelle's place,

Ingredients

2tbsp olive oil
1 yellow onion
4 cloves garlic

1 piece of fresh ginger Garam masala

Cumin

Cinnamon
Dried coriander

Tumeric

Method

Chop the onion, carrot, ginger and garlic finely.

Add olive oil to the pan, then the spices. Adding the spices in this early awakens them. This recipe suggests a combination of garam masala, cumin, cinnamon, coriander, tumric and chilli flakes, but you can choose others.

Add the onion and carrot to the pan and fry it with the spices until soft. Put in the garlic and ginger.

Put the red lentils in the pan and fry for a minute. Pour in the canned tomatoes, water and coconut milk. Add the vegetable stock cube. Let simmer for fifteen to twenty minutes. The lentils should be soft and the flavours pleasant.

Salt and pepper; taste and adjust.
While the daal is cooking, cook the rice.

Chilli flakes
1 carrot (if you have it)
1 vegetable stock cube
2 cans of canned tomato
1½ cans of water
1 package of red dried split lentils
1 package of coconut milk
1 lime
Enough rice for 4

First, wash the grains. Wash them several times, rub them in your hands under water to get rid of excess starch. The difference between washed and unwashed rice can be smelt.

To cook the rice, put the washed rice in cold water. The ratio should be approximately two cups of water to one cup of rice. Boil the rice in a pot under a cover. Check the rice after a few minutes. Taste it. Add a bit of water if it's too dry. It should cook very quickly; at most eight minutes. Fluff it up with a fork after removing the heat.

When the dal and the rice are ready, serve in bowls with a lime wedge. Optional: add fresh coriander, peanuts or cashews.

Eat with a spoon.

Finely ground coffee
Water

Method


Fill the bottom part of the moka pot with water until it reaches the valve and put it on medium heat. Fill the basket with coffee without tamping it. When the water gets warm, turn off the heat and put the basket in. Screw on the top part of the pot, but keep the lid open. Put it back on the stove. When the coffee starts flowing out of the canal, lower the heat slightly and close the lid. Finally, when you hear the coffee bubbling, turn the heat off and wait for a few seconds.
